SCHOOL CALENDAR, HOLIDAYS AND ACTIVITIES

The school publishes a calendar that is available at the school office. The school calendar comprises a detailed programme of exams, holidays, terms and inter-house activities. It must be compulsorily possessed by a student upon his/ her joining the school. Parents are advised to keep themselves informed about it. If needed an additional copy may be obtained. The school calendar contains detailed rules and regulations to be followed in the boarding house/school. A copy can also be downloaded from the school website (www.themannschool.com).

SCHOOL RULES FOR STUDENTS & PARENTS

Parents/Guardians will be bound by the rules in all respects as they are updated from time to time. In all matters of dispute, the decision of the Principal will be binding on the parents/guardians.

In accordance with the rules, parents/guardians will authorise the participation of their wards in compulsory programme of tours, treks, expeditions, camps, tournaments etc. during their stay at the school.

Parents/guardians will not hold the school responsible for any illness/accidents/mishaps and will not make any claims regarding past or future occurrences of illness, accidents or any other causes.

Parents/guardians will authorise the Principal, and through him the staff of the school, to act as local parent of their wards while they are at / outside the school or on tours etc.

On behalf of the parents/guardians, the Principal is authorised to take necessary action in case of any emergency, e.g. surgical operations or any other such situations where their permission is needed but cannot be obtained in time.

Use of prohibited substances, possession of mobile phones and leaving school without permission are strictly prohibited. Students involved in any such or similar activities may be expelled from the school.

Gadgets are strictly prohibited. If found, devices will be confiscated permanently and the student will also be fined ₹1500/-.

The Principal is fully empowered to remove a student from the boarding house if, in his opinion, the student has failed to abide by the school's disciplinary standards and if his

continued retention is detrimental to the interests of other students of the school.

Damage to school property, including library books, will have to be borne by the made good parents of the defaultures.

Parents are requested to refrain from applying for half-day leave, as it will not be granted.

Parents are requested to dress appropriately when visiting the school, as it boosts confidence and reflects a positive image.

BOARDING RULES

- It is desirable that the parents do not bring/send eatables, but if they are received, the eatables will be distributed amongst all the boarders equally .
- Boarders are not allowed to keep cash. Bank A/c may be opened in the bank on the school campus with the knowledge of HMs/Wardens. No money is to be given and no money should be sent directly to boarders. It may be notified here that unauthorised cash found with the boarder will be forfeited and made part of the House Fund. Possession of expensive article(s) is discouraged.
- Gadgets are allowed only under supervision of teachers at regulated timings. Personal Computing devices cannot be used for telephonic conversations. If students are found using personal computing devices for telephonic conversations, the device will be confiscated with fine a of ₹ 1500/-. Students maintaining an academic average of 75% and above may be granted the privilege of limited use of digital devices for academic preparation (through approved external and online learning resources), in accordance with school policy. Eligibility for this privilege shall be determined based on the marks obtained in each examination and will remain valid for the respective duration.
- To access the internet, it is mandatory to use only the school's Wi-Fi network. It is also mandatory to install the antivirus & web protection on personal computing devices, when using Wi-Fi network of the school. No other network such as GPRS, EDGE, 3G, 4G, Internet Dongle etc. are allowed to access the internet (if the facility is provided by the school).
- Boarders are expected to write/receive a letter fortnightly. Incoming letters must bear the ID No., Class & House of the student. Change of address should be communicated to the school immediately. Parents can also send email to their wards at the address: info@themannschool.com mentioning ID, name and house of their ward.
- Private clothes and shoes, other than the school pattern, are not allowed except for sweaters and jackets in winter. Students are expected to have a proper hair cut as per school regulations.
- For ordinary ailments, parents are not informed. If a student is admitted to the hospital, the guardian is communicated. Parents are requested to intimate the school if student is suffering from major illness or disease in the past.
- All correspondence by parents/guardians regarding a boarder should be addressed to the Principal.
- **Only parents or relatives nominated by parents shall be allowed to visit/meet their wards between 1400H-1600H on the last Saturday of the month.** However, parents who wish to take their wards for outing, shall collect them on last Saturday (as per regulations) of the month after school and leave them back by 1800H on Sunday. If the boarder does not report back the same day, they will be fined ₹ 2000 per day and the facility of outings would be withdrawn.

- Parents and guardians may meet their wards only in the designated lounge area, and that too after obtaining prior permission from the respective House Master or Warden. The boarding area (bedroom/studyroom/lobby) is strictly out of bounds for parents. This policy is enforced to maintain discipline, privacy, and security within the boarding premises, and must be complied with at all times.
- Parents are not allowed to communicate with the boarders on telephones. However, in any emergency, Principal/Housemaster/Warden can be contacted.
Your ward can contact you on the registered mobile number on Saturday evening and Sunday morning.
- There should be enough money in the personal account of every student. In its absence, no town leave will be granted and the student will not be permitted to draw any item from the tuck shop.
- The amount of money in the student's personal account ought to be replenished every six months. This money is not to be used for purchasing private clothing, gifts for friends etc.
- Parents are requested to visit their ward only according to the given schedule, as unscheduled visits disrupt the school's routine. However, in case of an emergency, visits may be allowed with **prior permission**.

LEAVE REGULATION (Boarders)

Boarders are not allowed to go home during the school term except in such cases as mentioned below:

- Leaves will not be granted during examination days, annual events, school functions and inter-house/school competitions. Boarders may be allowed a maximum of two days leave for the wedding of his/her own brother or sister.
- Leave may be granted for any particular medical treatment. If a student is absent due to illness, application to that effect must be accompanied by a medical certificate from a government registered MBBS doctor.
- For all kinds of leave, written request or an email (from the email ID as given in school record) by parents/guardians must be made to the Principal / HMs/Wdns in advance. **No leave will be granted on a student's request or a request made on telephone.**
- Leave will be considered only when the application is made by the parents or the guardian and approved by the Principal.
- Parents/Guardians should note the date and time of their ward's return to school after leave. If he/she does not report on due date, his/her name will be struck off the school rolls and he/she may not be accepted back. The same rule applies to returning late after summer or winter vacation. Latecomers will be fined ₹2000/- per day. Thereafter, their names will be struck off the rolls and re-admission fee shall be charged.
- Parents/Guardians to ensure that while taking the students from boarding, they must collect gate pass from House Master/Warden. When they are reporting back, from leave/outing/vacation, they must report to Housemaster/Warden prior to entering the house.

REGULATION FOR BOARDERS

Tuck Shop

The school maintains a tuck shop where text books, exercise books and school uniforms are available. Boarders can meet their requirements for toiletries and stationery from the shop and the cost will be debited to their personal accounts. However, it is not compulsory to buy items from this shop.

Visiting Hours

Visiting the Principal: 1000H to 1100H on working days with a **prior appointment**. School work suffers if parents and visitors come unannounced or without prior appointment. Details are mentioned at the end of the calendar.

Medical Care

The parent will get the ward examined by a qualified doctor and submit his/her medical fitness certificate at the time of the admission along with other necessary documents. Minor treatment expenses are met by the school. Cost of any major treatment is debited to the personal account of the boarder.

Birthday

No leave is granted for celebrating birthday. However, if the parents wish, the school will arrange/organise the celebration house-wise. Birthday celebration will be as per the date of birth entered in the admission form. Parents can visit their ward on his/her birthday. The expenses incurred will be debited to the student's personal account.

Bringing eatables from outside for birthday celebrations is strictly prohibited. Chocolates intended for distribution must be purchased exclusively from the school tuck shop. Only a birthday cake may be brought by the parents of boarding students on the occasion of their ward's birthday.

GENERAL RULES FOR STUDENTS

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR

- The school gate will be closed for students at 0745H, and no entry will be permitted thereafter. No student will be allowed to leave the school before 1405H. Any student not properly turned out will be sent home at the parents' expense. For dress regulations, please refer to the school prospectus and the circulars issued separately.
- The school expects students to be polite, friendly and well behaved in and outside the school. They should be respectful to their elders and teachers, honest and truthful at all times.
- Students must keep their classroom and the campus clean and tidy.
- Work is worship. Decorum should be maintained in the classroom. Students should be attentive and respectful towards their teachers and classmates/peers.
- Students are to speak in English in school and outside, so as to maintain a suitable level of conversation and enhance their conversation skills. Those who are weak in English need to be encouraged.
- In the absence of the teacher, the class-monitor assumes responsibility for the order and discipline of the class. He should fulfill his duty with loyalty and impartiality. He is not permitted to punish the students.
- No collective petition will be entertained but reasonable individuals requests will be consider sympathetically.
- Any form of ragging is strictly prohibited. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those found guilty.

PAYING MARK OF RESPECT AND GREETINGS

Students must greet faculty members, administrative staff, visitors and ladies and gentlemen separately.

TURNOUT AND HYGIENE

Students must maintain a neat and smart appearance at all times. For this they should ensure that:-

- They must brush their teeth twice daily & keep the nails clean and trimmed
- They must get a hair cut timely and regularly
- They must take bath regularly and properly
- They must comb their hair properly
- They must polish their shoes daily and keep their socks clean
- They must dress up for various activities as per guidelines issued from time to time

DORMITORIES

Students should not:

- Borrow /lend articles and money
- Keep valuables and attractive items with them
- Rest in the dormitories during school/games hours unless permitted by the School Medical Officer
- Use others' toiletries

Points to be noted

- All clothes should be tagged with the students' Ids
- Sundays/holidays should be utilised by students for maintenance of their uniform
- They should handover soiled linen in the laundry bags, after noting them in the laundry book and deposit the same to the Warden / Housemasters.

Students should remember to:

- Visit the toilet before going to bed
- Make their beds after use. They should not sleep on the bed covers
- Close the taps when not in use
- Switch off the lights / fans when not in use or leaving class room/dormitories
- Carry out the instructions and suggestions passed by the School /House Captains

CLASS ROOMS

- Students must be punctual for the classes.
- Complete silence should be maintained in the classrooms.
- Students should keep their desks, cup-boards and classroom neat and tidy.
- The classroom furniture, walls, multimedia boards etc. must be saved from mutilation. Any damage should be brought to the notice of the class teacher.
- Students should keep their books and exercise books properly arranged. Any loss of book or damage should be brought to the notice of the class teacher.
- Students should enter & leave their classrooms in formation & in an orderly manner.
- They should square up their class rooms before leaving them at cease work.

SCHOOL UNIFORM (Only school pattern uniforms are permitted)

SUMMER (1 April to 31 October)

Boys: Sky blue half sleeves shirts with grey terry cotton shorts/trousers (Class IX

onwards), school belt, black socks & shoes. Turban (Sky blue) for Sikh students.

Girls: Sky blue half sleeves shirts with grey terry cotton skirt/trousers, school belt, black socks & shoes.

Sports Dress: House T-shirts, blue games shorts, white socks & shoes as per school pattern. Patka sky blue/black for Sikh students.

WINTER (1st November to 31st March)

Boys: Sky blue full sleeves shirts with grey woollen trousers, school pullover with or without sleeves, school blazer (navy blue) with monogram, school tie, pocket square, school belt, black socks & shoes. Turban (Sky blue) for Sikh students.

Girls: Sky blue full sleeves shirts with grey woollen skirts/ trousers, school pullover with or without sleeves, school blazer (navy blue) with monogram, school tie, pocket square, school belt, black socks & shoes.

Sports Dress: Track suit, House T-shirts, white socks & shoes as per school pattern.

GENERAL DRESS ETIQUETTE

Impression of a person is created within minutes of meeting by the way he/she is dressed up. The clothes you wear reflect your personality. Take pride in wearing your uniforms.

For Gentlemen

- A tie & suit/ coat are must for a presentation. Ties should be properly tied
- A tie should never be worn with casual and sports shoes
- Please remove the labels sewn on the outside of the coat / blazer sleeve. These are meant to identify the manufacturer at the time of purchase, but should be removed before wearing. Also, clip the stitching, that holds the back vent closed
- Do not stand with one or both hands in your pockets. It looks sloppy and makes you look nervous.
- All clothing should be ironed, so that it is free of wrinkles
- Shirts should be always tucked in
- A handkerchief should always be a part of a person's wardrobe. Gentlemen and boys should use full-sized white ones with thin stripes
- A pen should always be in the inside pocket of the coat and never in the outer pocket
- When wearing 3 button coat/blazer, the middle button should be fastened and in case of single breasted/ coat/blazer, the upper button should be fastened

For Ladies

- Skirts should be of the knee length. Wear no more than one ear ring per ear.
- Remove all body-piercing jewellery.
- Clothing should not be too tight, too sloppy, or show too much skin.
- All clothing should be ironed, so that it is free of wrinkles.
- Ladies and girls should use delicate lace-edged handkerchief.
- Comb hair properly. Those who have long hair, should tie up neatly. A hair band should be worn if you have short hair.

What to Wear

There are degrees of casual wear, ranging from acceptable for business to suitable for gardening at home. The trick is to dress appropriately for the activity.

Casual Dress: For both men & women casual denotes sports attire appropriate for barbecues, patio or pool parties, casual suppers & sporting events. If you are going to actually engage in a sport, of course, wear the appropriate outfit.

Dress/Smart Casual: Men wear trousers (long or short) and collared shirt, with or without a tie/scarf, with a sweater or a sport jacket depending on the weather.

Totally Casual: Any attire less formal than what is described above, which should only be worn at home, to the supermarket, or camping. Hats should not be worn indoors, in restaurants, movies, theatres, offices, or homes.

Types of coats: Jackets, Blazers, Bomber jacket, Dinner jacket (DJ), Fleece, Mandarin collar jacket.

Overcoats: Cloak, Mackintosh, Raincoat, Topcoat and Parka.

Formal: Men should wear dark/light coloured suit or blazer with shirt (traditionally white) and tie with leather shoes (Refer MSFS content for better understanding). After six o'clock, formal dress means a dark suit with a tie or a bow and leather shoes.

Grooming

- Your clothes should be clean & neatly ironed
- Deodorants /Anti-perspirants should be used mildly
- Use just enough spray to create a pleasant fragrance. Your shoes should always be polished
- Wear loosely fitting clothes when going to bed like night - suit
- Rubber/Bathrooms slippers should not be worn in the Dining Hall / Restaurants
- Ties should be worn with full sleeves shirt
- Long sleeves undergarment below a half sleeves shirt/T-shirt is not advisable

How to dress for an interview

Regardless of the kind of position for which you are interviewing for, take a moment to consider how you will dress. Some employees will require a suit. For others, "business casual" may be acceptable. A good guideline to follow is to dress as others do in the same occupation. If in doubt, ask a human resources staff member what they consider appropriate attire for an interview.

Ladies



Women should wear a simple, tailored suit, or dress, or saree, conservative nail polish and lipstick, and hair should preferably be neatly tucked at the back. Flashy earrings should be avoided.

Gentlemen

- Perfume and make-up should be used in moderation.
- Wear a clean, ironed suit with a non-flashy shirt, tie & leather shoes.
- Coat /blazer should be worn keeping in mind the weather conditions.
- Your hair should be neat and trimmed.
- Sikh gentlemen should wear a neat and well tied turban.
- Long hair, pony tails, and extremely long side burns should also be trimmed.
- It is advisable to be clean shaven for interviews.
- Be sure to pay attention to small details such as cleaning and trimming your fingernails and choosing a conservative watch and jewellery.

PARENTS TO NOTE

1. Visiting Hours
 - Visiting the Principal : 1000H to 1100H (with prior appointment)
 - Visiting the Teachers : 1130H to 1330H (Only on PTM days)
 - a) PTM for Day Scholars : 2nd Saturday of the month
 - b) PTM for Boarders : Last Saturday of the month
2. School gate will be closed at 0745H for students. No entry permitted thereafter.
3. No student will be permitted to leave the school before 1405H.
4. A student not properly turned out will be sent home at the expense of the parents. For dress regulations refer to school prospectus & circulars sent separately.

LEAVE RULES

1. It is compulsory for all students to have a minimum of 75% attendance to appear in annual examination.
2. Long medical leave due to illness (more than 3 days in continuation) should always be supported by medical certificate from a registered MBBS Doctor.
3. Leave is permitted for attending the marriage of a student's sibling only, if there are no exams during that period.
4. Absence for more than ten continuous days will result in the name of the student being struck off automatically.
5. Leave is a privilege, not a right, and will be granted only when requested in advance and duly approved.

BOARDERS

1. Boarders can be visited & taken for outings only by parents /authorised guardians on last Saturday of the month or on prescribed days as mentioned in the school calendar.
2. Students are to proceed on vacation/outings in school uniform and must report back in school uniform. Late comers will be fined as per school norms mentioned in calendar.
3. House Masters will be available for consultation on the days, students proceed/report from outings.
4. The boarders are allowed to call their parents through house landline system on every Saturday evening and Sunday morning.
5. Gadgets are strictly prohibited for students in the school campus. Anyone found with gadgets will be fined Rs.1500/- and the gadget will be confiscated for good.

WEEKLY BOARDING

1. Fee structure will remain the same for weekly boarding and full boarding students.
2. Weekly boarding facility shall be available only for children of Delhi/NCR domicile.
3. Under no circumstances, students of weekly boarding shall be converted to a dayscholar during the session.

4. Outing schedule should be strictly followed. (Saturday 2 pm to Sunday 6 pm). Non-compliance will lead to cancellation of weekly boarding privileges.
5. Students in Weekly boarding are expected to take part in week-end inter-house or inter-school activities/ competitions for which no weekly leave/off will be granted.
6. Students of weekly boarding, if found to carry any unauthorised items like Mobile phones, Cash, Electronic devices, Narcotics to school, shall be rusticated from the school and no fee refund shall be made.
7. Students in weekly boarding are expected to complete the assignments/project work given to them during their weekend outing.
8. During examination and other special functions this facility will not be available to Weekly boarding students.
9. Only parents/siblings of weekly boarding students will be allowed to pick them up for weekly outing. No other guardian shall be allowed.
10. School shall reserve the right to cancel this facility if the student is found to be lacking in academics/discipline.
11. Any dispute shall be subject to jurisdiction of courts in Delhi only.

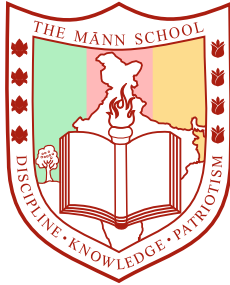
